## 2310. PRACTICE

SUNDAY CONTACT -- No high school interscholastic contests, practices for interscholastic contests, camps, nor association between participants and coaches/directors of any CHSAA sanctioned **sport** activity from the student's school shall take place on Sundays at any time during the school year. (This is to include both in season and out of season sports/activities other than those noted in the Music Bylaws.) The Commissioner may, when deemed advisable, allow postponed state-level events to be played on Sunday. Teams playing on Monday in district, regional or in a state-culminating event will be exempt from this rule.

EXCEPTION 1-A coach may have contact with his or her team on Sunday for a social, academic or service related activity that is strictly voluntary. The contact must be a voluntary, non-competitive/non-participatory activity.

<u>EXCEPTION 2 – During the school year, schools may petition the Commissioner for a waiver of the Sunday Contact Rule based upon religious, cultural, or educationally based events (non-athletic).</u>

EXCEPTION  $\frac{2}{3}$  – Teams may participate and represent their schools, in or out of season, with coach/directors in attendance, on a Sunday in national events sponsored by the NFHS (National Federation of High Schools).

RATIONALE: Allows for reasonable accommodations to be made for schools having difficult scheduling <u>activities</u> based on religious, cultural or educationally based events. Currently many music and speech schools are participating on Sundays, and this bylaw would align current practice.

PROS: Allows more flexibility for speech and music students and directors with scheduling of events – many times due to facility constraints.

CONS: Allows for Sunday Contact to happen for activity events – pending approval by the Commissioner.
